Flying Dog Film Series Continues with “A Life Less Ordinary”

FREDERICK, Md., Wednesday, February 14, 2018 — “A Life Less Ordinary” will be the next film screened as part of the Weinberg Center for the Arts’ Flying Dog Movie Series. This 1997 comedy will be screened on Wednesday, February 28 at 7:30pm, following a 6:30pm happy hour in the theater’s lobby.

The film is rated R with a runtime of 103 minutes, and stars Ewan McGregor, Cameron Diaz, and Holly Hunter. Heaven resembles a modern police department, and its angels are given “cases” to ensure that mortals on Earth find love. Now, a new rule is in place for O’Reilly and Jackson, two underperforming angel partners: they must successfully resolve their next case by helping two mortals fall in love, or else they will be forced to stay on Earth forever. Robert Lewis, a janitor in L.A., takes his boss’ daughter Celine hostage after being fired and replaced by a robot.
