### ***“Tombstone” to Kick Off Annual Flying Dog Film Series***

FREDERICK, Md., Tuesday, September 19, 2017 — 1993 Western film “Tombstone” will kick off the 2017-2018 Flying Dog Film Series as the Weinberg Center for the Arts’ first event of the season. The film will screen on Wednesday, September 27 at 7:30pm, with a pre-show happy hour beginning at 6:30pm.

The cult classic is based on multiple real events that occurred in Tombstone, Arizona in the 1880s, including the Gunfight at the O.K. Corral and the Earp Vendetta Ride. It depicts a number of Western outlaws and lawmen, such as Wyatt Earp, William Brocius, Johnny Ringo, and Doc Holliday. The film stars Kurt Russell and Val Kilmer, and was directed by George P. Cosmatos. “Tombstone” is rated R for violence and has a runtime of 130 minutes.
