### Folk Trio Ghost of Paul Revere comes to the Weinberg Center

FREDERICK, MD, Monday, January 7, 2019— The Tivoli Discovery Series welcomes the Maine-grown, foot-stompin' holler-folk trio, [Ghost of Paul Revere](#) to the Weinberg Center for the Arts on Thursday February 7, 2019 at 7:30 PM.

Known as the rowdy pickers from the north, Ghost of Paul Revere is an American folk trio from Portland, Maine. They describe their music as “holler funk” because it invokes the rich communal tradition of field hollers, with their call-and-response melodies, sing-along hooks and densely layered harmonies. Hitting listeners straight in the feelings has been the band’s goal since its inception in 2011, and they’ve been using their powerful stage show to do just that.

“We grew up listening to Radiohead and the Beatles and Led Zeppelin and Pink Floyd,” says Griffin Sherry, guitarist/singer in the Ghost of Paul Revere. “Everyone assumed we were a bluegrass band because we were playing these traditional instruments, but we weren’t writing traditional music. We were just writing songs with the instruments we had.”
