Musician Lionel Loueke describes the group with adjectives like soulful and groovy, saying “I dare you not to dance or be in a good mood during and after listening to this beautiful music.” The band formed in Columbus, Ohio and is now based in Brooklyn, NY. They’ve performed in more than 20 countries worldwide and continue to tour the United States and abroad. Their latest release, “Passport,” is a collection of songs inspired by their experiences sharing music with people from all over the world. Hunbertones includes Dan White on saxophone; Jon Lampley on trumpet and sousaphone; Chris Ott on trombone and beatboxing; Adam DeAscentis on bass guitar; John Hubbell on drums; Josh Hill on guitar and Justin Stanton on keyboard and trumpet.
